Dr. Julie Schneider is Professor of Neurology and Neuropathology and Associate Director of the Rush Alzheimer's Disease Center. She received her training at The University of Chicago and Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia. Dr. Schneider has extensive experience with clinical-pathologic epidemiologic studies of aging and dementia, has over 200 peer-reviewed publications, and has presented her research nationally and internationally.

Dr. Schneider's research focuses on pathologic factors associated with cognitive and motor decline in aging. She has also investigated the use of pathologic endophenotypes to link risk factors (e.g., genetic, diet, behavioral and life style), biomarkers, and other factors to impairment and resilience.

The annual *Stanley van den Noort Lecture* was established in 2011, to honor the memory of Stanley van den Noort, MD, a pioneer in neurological education, research and patient care. He personally touched the lives of many during his nearly 40-year association with UC Irvine. An influential former Dean of the UC Irvine School of Medicine, Dr. van den Noort played an integral role in helping the school become a nationally ranked and respected institution.
